Capital Campaign - Opened Health Care Doors

Thanks to the generous commitment of individuals, corporate partners, and foundations, The Campaign for Franke Tobey Jones: *Historic past; Innovative future* raised over 2.5 million dollars and opened the doors to a new, state of the art health and memory care building.

Charitable Subsidy - Provided Comfort of Home

In 2019, Franke Tobey Jones confidentially distributed approximately \$400,000 in assistance to our valued residents who have outlived their assets.

Senior University – Empowered the Mind

Lifelong learning is about renewal of the mind and spirit. With your support, we offered 403 lifelong learning programs, which welcomed 487 program participants.

Wellness Program – Strengthened Body and Soul

The Wellness Center purchased four pieces of new exercise equipment and offered 1,761 classes and 950 personal training sessions to the senior community.

The Center welcomed 700 participants per month with a total of 36,973 program participants – a 10% increase from 2018 - for activities and programs as well as for nutritious meals.
