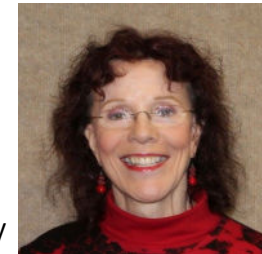
Planned Giving

Jeanette grew up in the North End of Tacoma. She is the second oldest of 8 children, with 6 brothers and 1 sister. They are all very close to each other, five of them all living in the North End. Jeanette always had a strong work ethic and a compassionate heart for others. She worked her way through college earning a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing becoming a Registered Nurse. As a side note, she took her psychiatric training at Dammasch State Hospital in Wilsonville Oregon, where the movie, “*One Flew Over the Cuckoo’s Nest*” was filmed. Her career includes working 28 years as a Public Health Nurse for Seattle King County Department of Public Health, then retiring to work another 11 years as a charge nurse at Western State Hospital in Steilacoom, WA, retiring for a second time at the end of 2018.

Jeanette is passionate about improving the quality of people’s lives, and the environmental conditions in which they live, not only here but also around the globe. She became a philanthropist at an early age, supporting a child in need through a nonprofit. She has been donating monthly, dating back to 2008, to a least thirteen organizations.
