Hard Decisions at the End of Life*

The ethics of healthcare at the end of life have evolved. We now give patients the option of refusing treatment when there are no reasonable prospects for getting better. What's more, many states give patients the option of self-administering a lethal dose of medication should they meet certain conditions. However, these changes in practice have not really clarified the ethical principles behind the practices. In this class I want to examine the use of palliative sedation, that is, giving a patient powerful drugs such as fentanyl, when there is no reasonable prospect of recovery, and it is also understood that administering these drugs will shorten the patient's life. If this practice ends the patient's life, what is the difference, morally speaking, between palliative sedation and active euthanasia?

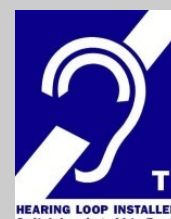

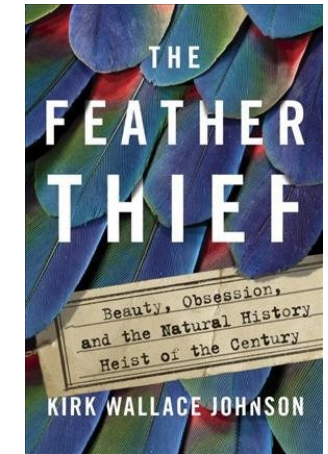
