Paint and Sip at Senior University





Literary League Book Club— Heart Berries: A Memoir*
Join us as we discuss Heart Berries: A Memoir by Terese
Marie Mailhot

About the book: *Heart Berries* is a powerful, poetic memoir of a woman's coming of age on the Seabird Island Indian Reservation in the Pacific Northwest. Having survived a profoundly dysfunctional upbringing only to find herself hospitalized and facing a dual diagnosis of post -traumatic stress disorder and bipolar II disorder, Terese Marie Mailhot is given a notebook and begins to write her way out of trauma. The triumphant result is *Heart Berries*, a memorial for Mailhot's mother, a social worker and activist who had a thing for prisoners; a story of reconciliation with her father-an abusive drunk and a brilliant artist-who was murdered under mysterious circumstances; and an elegy on how difficult it is to love someone while dragging the long shadows of shame. 2:00 pm, Bristol View 1st Floor Bowditch Room
