Our newest exhibit features Women of the Menominee River. One of those women is Franke Tobey Jones (1845-1931). Mrs. Jones was the wife of a lumber baron, and a very savvy businesswoman. After their company went bankrupt, she is credited with helping build back that company, which would go on to become the world's primary lumber supplier at one point, with its own line of steamships and satellite companies as far as China and Japan. During her retirement days in the State of Washington, Mrs. Jones founded a nursing home, which was an uncommon thing at that time. This home, called the Franke Tobey Jones Assisted Living Home, is still in existence today and has aided thousands of residents. To read her full story, stop by the museum!
