Dr. Glenn Guhr is a singer, actor, director, and teacher active in the Puget Sound region for the last 30 years. He has appeared in operas, operettas, musicals, plays, and film. Dr. Guhr is also an educator, with experience in vocal and dramatic instruction, lecturing on music history, and outreach performance programs. Dr. Guhr acted as Tacoma Opera's Production/Education and Outreach Manager during the Covid shutdown and subsequent reopening, arranging dozens of short, online


recitals and directing several opera films for online viewing. His most recent directorial efforts include productions of Faust and Cenerentola for Kitsap Opera.
